About the role

An exciting opportunity has become available for 5 permanent Lay Clerks to join us at the Cathedral, working an average of 16 hours per week on a salary of £19,097 pro rata per annum. This will be made up of 2 Altos, 2 Tenors and 1 Bass Lay Clerk.

Working within the Liturgy and Music Department and reporting into the Director of Music, the post holders will play in important role in the Choral Foundation, providing the music for the statutory Cathedral services.

About what you will be doing

The Foundation also includes 22 boy choristers who attend The Pilgrims' School, which is situated within the Close, 20 Girl choristers aged between 11 and 18 who are drawn from local schools, and approximately 12 Lay Clerks. Between them, they normally sing eight services a week.

Principal Duties:

The Cathedral Lay Clerks are full members of the Cathedral Choir, and their normal weekly pattern of statutory choral services is as follows:

Sunday

9.15 am Rehearsal (10.30 when there is only one sung service in the morning)
9.45 am Mattins*
11.00 am Eucharist* (on some Sundays, there is only one sung service in the morning)
2.00 pm Debegrad

3.00 pm Rehearsal 3.30 pm Evensong

Monday, Tuesday, Thursday 5.00 pm Rehearsal 5.30 pm Evensong (*Tuesday: Lay Clerks only)

Friday

5.00 pm Rehearsal5.30 pm Evensong6.15 pm Rehearsal until 7.00pm

Saturday

4.45 pm Rehearsal 5.30 pm Evensong

On Wednesdays, the choir is not normally expected to attend. Ash Wednesday, when it falls during term time, is an exception and Lay Clerks are expected to work.



Additional Duties:

- Additional rehearsals may be expected from time to time as advised by the Director of Music. On these occasions, as much notice as possible will be given.
- In addition to the above weekly duties, attend additional Cathedral services and events as arranged by Chapter. Typically, these would include but is not limited to the Liturgy of Holy Week, the Friends Festival, Carol Services at Advent and Christmas and some Feast days of the Church.

• Once or twice a year, fundraising concerts may also be included as a statutory attendance at the discretion of the Director of Music.

- Additional duties include attendance at staff meetings, termly Lay Clerk meetings, training and other music development opportunities, for which an allowance of hours is made.
- Winchester Cathedral takes part in the Southern Cathedrals Festival and there is an expectation for Lay Clerks to be involved in this for an additional fee.
- There are opportunities to earn fees for concerts (including the Southern Cathedrals Festival), broadcasts, weddings and memorial services

About your experience

About the process

The care and protection of children, young people and adults involved in Cathedral activities is the responsibility of everyone who participates in the life of the Cathedral Community.

All shortlisted candidates will be required to complete an application form and a Confidential Declaration form prior to interview. Successful candidates will be subject to pre-employment checks, including two satisfactory references, a DBS check where appropriate and Basic and Foundations Safeguarding training relevant to the role.

The closing date for this role is Friday 24th January. Stage 1 of the interviews will be held on Friday 7th February. This will consist of a Vocal audition followed by a competencybased interview for successful candidates. Stage 2 of the interviews will be held on a Tuesday afternoon, the date of which is to be confirmed, where the final group will sing together with the Lay Clerks at Evensong.
